

KS1 Home Learning Project: Our Wonderful World

18.05.2020 – 29.05.2020

Begin by looking at 'Windows' by Jeannie Baker and discuss what you can see with an adult - <https://youtu.be/4JLVneJa1Is>

Maths – (Aim to alternate between maths and English each day)

- Can you count how many steps it takes to travel around your garden? Then as a 'Challenge' can you repeat it counting in 2's 5's and 10's.
- Watch the birds land in your garden or fly past. Count how many you see in 5 minutes, 10 minutes or 15 minutes.
- How many feet? Draw around your foot and cut it out; now measure different things in your home using the foot. What language can you use to describe them?

- Practise addition and subtraction

English - (Aim to alternate between maths and English each day)

- Write some sentences about why we should not litter.
- Can you talk to an adult and explain to them how littering affects animals?
- What did Morris notice was happening to the flowers and plants as more rubbish was left?
- How did the stream change as more rubbish polluted it?
- Daily phonics – Pupils need to practise Phase 2 and Phase 3 sounds and blending and segmenting words. There are plenty of games on Phonics Play.
- Practise reading and spelling Phase 4 tricky words – **do, so, like, come, some, said, there, one, have, little, out, were, when, what.**
- Remember to read a book each day.

Nature

1. Go into your garden.
2. Find an undisturbed corner that no one goes into.
3. Collect a pile of twigs and leaves and pile them up in that corner.
4. Leave them alone for a few days and watch.
5. What range of wildlife will visit your garden?
6. Can you record how many different insects and animals visit? How are you going to do this?



Expressive Arts and Design

Make a hat for yourself out of recycled materials e.g., bin bags, carrier bags, newspaper, magazines, yoghurt pots, cereal boxes etc.

Try and be as creative as you can!! Don't forget to send your teacher a picture of your finished hat being modelled by you!



Physical Development

With the sky being less polluted we can see the stars much more clearly at night. To celebrate this, ask an adult to help you to make Star Biscuits.

Ingredients

- 100g butter
- 50g caster sugar
- 175g plain flour
- A few drops of vanilla extract
- 1 egg

Equipment

- Bowl
- Spoon
- Rolling pin
- Star cookie cutter (or shape them yourself!)
- Baking tray



Method

1. Preheat the oven to 150°C.
2. Add butter and sugar in a bowl and mix well until light and fluffy.
3. Add the vanilla, egg and mix, then add the flour and mix well.
4. Roll out to about 5mm thick. Cut into star shapes.
5. Bake for 25 minutes or until golden brown.
